March 2017 Message from Pastor Anne

Dear Collbran Congregational, United Church of Christ Church Family and Friends,

It is with a joyful heart, filled with affection and anticipation, that I greet you as we usher in our second year together! Our Annual Meeting was well attended on January 29, 2017. Thank you for your love, support, and encouragement in our journey together. I will strive to continue to provide meaningful and inspiring worship, cherishing long held traditions as well as breathing new life and ideas (together as a team) into our worship. Pastoral Care is always a priority for me as well.

The Season of Lent is upon us! We observed Ash Wednesday immediately following the Sunday, February 26 worship service. This was a creative way to share the tradition of an Ash Wednesday Service ~ and the imposition of ashes ~ on a Sunday morning.

The season of Lent is one of thoughtful reflection. During this time of the church calendar, Christians ponder the unfolding events that led to Jesus' condemnation and crucifixion: His triumphal march into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday; His firm words of warning about the events to come; His trial, brutal scourging, and horrific crucifixion. No day could be any darker; no travesty more calamitous than the slaying of God's own Beloved Son. And yet, that's what we find on Golgotha: our sins demanding His death on a cross to satisfy the Father's righteous judgment. Taken from the cross, the lifeless form of Christ was placed in another man's tomb. With that action the world thought the ordeal complete. But God's work was not quite done. Three days later, out of a sealed tomb (guarded to prevent theft) Jesus rose from the dead. And with that thunderous crescendo, mankind's disgrace is forgiven through the blood of Christ. Lent is when we turn our eyes to the cross. It is there where Jesus, the sinless Son of God, suffered the indignity and shame of dying for our sins. And it is there where God's wrath was satisfied by His Beloved Son's supreme sacrifice, winning salvation for all who call Him their Savior. (Source lhm.org devotional) I invite you to join us with your presence and within your prayers as we embark on the pathway to Easter, through the Journey and Season of Lent.

DINING ROOM FURNACE REPLACEMENTS

After serving the Valley for forty-plus years, the two dining room heaters began to fail and the room was too cold for comfort. Donations given specifically to support the heater fund were used to help pay for their replacement, as well as memorial monies honoring Neta and Ben Hayes, Velma McDaniel-Marek and Larry Price.

Various other groups and organizations use the Community Building. 4-H Clubs meet in the basement, gymnastics and basketball in the gymnasium, Grey Gourmet in the dining room, and a new addition is music lessons upstairs. There are, frequently, family parties in the dining room and the park is a busy place in the summertime. Chairs and tables are rented for many events around our valley.

The fees we have set at a level to be welcoming but they don't cover even the basic costs of building upkeep and maintenance. We feel it is important to keep the building busy and used.

Upgrades and replacements to the aging building are frequently very expensive and the costs are outside of the church budget. The replacement cost was \$7,000.00 for the pair of new heating units for the dining room.
