TRUSTEES REPORT

The new furnaces have been installed in the dining room. Of course, the first day we try them out was the coldest day of the winter, and we were all questioning how well they were working until we had to run to the car for something upon returning the room felt wonderfully warm. We will keep checking on their efficiency. Thanks to Mike for the work done around the building.

The new sealant was applied to the east side of the foundation between the pastor's office and the gym entrance in an effort to dry up the moisture that is affecting the room known as the 4-H room or Old Library, depending on your age. We will keep checking, and when we believe we have solved the moisture issue, we will let those groups who are using the room for meetings or storage know so the room can be cleared, and the church can proceed with a remodel or restoration in that space. Please don't panic about moving, but we ask that those affected start making plans for off-site storage during the remodel.

The ice is back on the east sidewalk. Please watch for the orange cones and any build-up of ice. We will try to keep the sidewalks clear and salted. It is important that you let someone know if you see something that may be a danger and appears unattended.

The gym is seeing new use for youth basketball practice 2-3 afternoons a week. We try to keep the cost at a minimum to encourage valley and community use of the facilities.
